Research Focus and Gap Identification



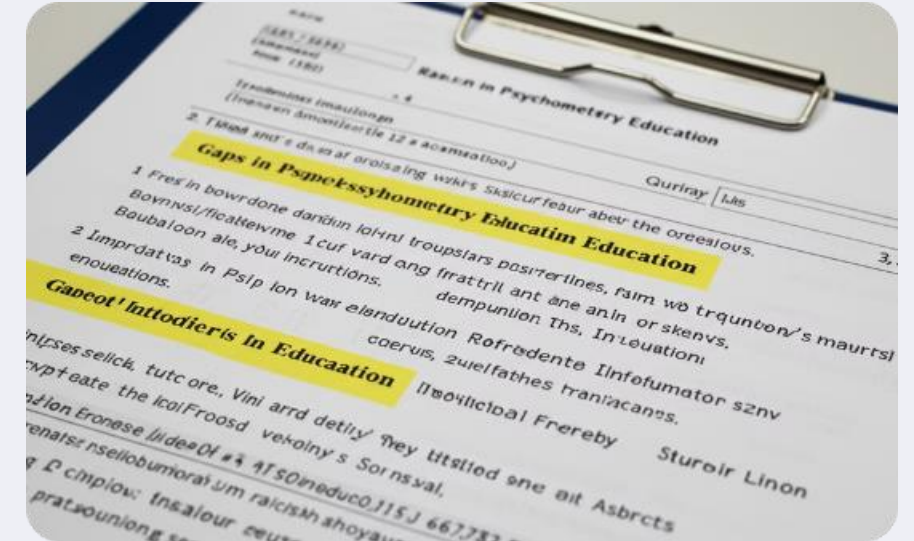
Lack of Support

To address her anxiety, Jane attended counselling sessions that equipped her with stress management techniques and coping strategies.

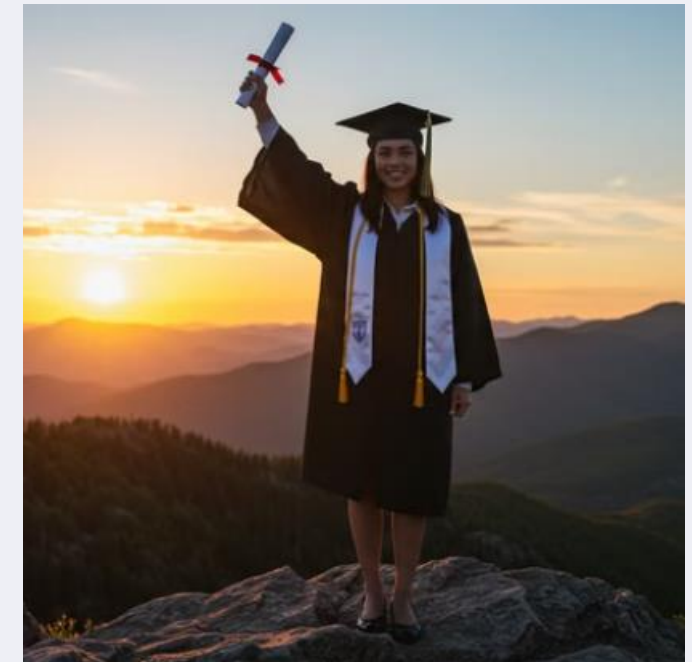


University Resources
